## WHAT THIS SHOWS

- A There was unexpected use of fentanyl, benzodiazepines and stimulants in every region
- **A** The extent of expected and unexpected use varied greatly by region

## WHAT THIS MEANS

- People are being exposed to substances without their knowledge
  - It is hard to pinpoint how much this is happening because it varies across the country and over time
- Our findings are one example that the unregulated drug supply is **unpredictable** 
  - o There is no quality control so unexpected substances appear and change all the time
  - o Even expected drugs occur in unexpected amounts and pose their own risks (not shown here)o This makes it difficult to prepare for and prevent emergencies and deaths
- This is driving accidental drug poisoning and our current drug poisoning crisis

## WHAT YOU CAN DO

- Learn more and tell others about the unpredictable drug supply and unintentional drug exposure
- Learn how to use naloxone to help address unintentional opioid poisoning
- Engage with your community to help find ways to get ahead of the problem and address its risks
